The regulations in Section 4, <u>General Information and Regulations</u>, located on the <u>University</u> <u>Calendar</u> are applicable for the listed programmes.

On occasion, programmes can be exempted from one or more of the clauses in these Regulations, or one or more of the clauses can be varied.

- Exemptions are characterised by the omission of the relevant clause.
- Variations are characterised by the replacement of the clause with alternative wording.

The programmes listed have approval from the Academic Quality and Standards Committee for the **exemptions** and/or **variations** to the regulations noted below.

Additional requirements are also listed.

Exemptions

The clause(s) listed below describe where an exemption to the General Academic Regulations exists.

Programme: Low Intensity Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT) with Improving Access to Psychological Therapies (IAPT) Psychological Wellbeing Practitioner (PWP) status – level 6 is exempt from clause 5.1 of the <u>Progression, Determination and Classification of Results: Undergraduate and Integrated Masters Programmes.</u> There is no opportunity to repeat module 1 or module 2 of the programme.

Programme(s) Bachelor of Nursing (Honours) Adult Nursing, Bachelor of Nursing (Honours) Children's Nursing, Bachelor of Nursing (Honours) Mental Health Nursing, Bachelor of Nursing (Honours) Children's and Mental Health Nursing, Bachelor of Nursing (Honours) Children's and Adult Nursing, Bachelor of Nursing (Honours) Adult and Mental Health Nursing, Bachelor of Science (Honours) Midwifery, Bachelor of Science (Honours) Midwifery with Advanced Standing, Bachelor of Science (Honours) Adult Nursing, Bachelor of Science (Honours) Children's Nursing, Bachelor of Science (Honours) Mental Health Nursing, Master of Nursing Adult & Mental Health Nursing, Master of Nursing Children's & Mental Health Nursing, Bachelor of Science (Honours) Healthcare Science (Cardiac Physiology) or Bachelor of Science (Honours) Occupational Therapy, Bachelor of Science (Honours) Physiotherapy, Bachelor of Science (Honours) Podiatry are exempt from 3.1 and 5.1 of the Progression, Determination and Classification of Results: Undergraduate and Integrated Masters Programmes. Repeat attempts may only be taken externally and may not include repeat of any practice modules. The programmes of students who fail practice modules, following any permitted referral attempt, with therefore be terminated.

- Programmes which lead to registration with the following Professional, Statutory & Regulatory Bodies (PSRBs) the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC), the Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC), the Registration Council for Clinical Physiologists (RCCP) and the National School (NS) are exempt from the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act [1986]. Applicants and students are required to be of good health and good character and worthy of professional registration.
- All students will be subject to an enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check on admission. Continuation on the programme is subject to consideration of any criminal convictions, cautions and pending criminal investigations. All students are required to inform the School of all criminal convictions both prior to and throughout their period of enrolment, at the earliest opportunity.
- A satisfactory Occupational Health assessment is a condition of entry to the programme.
 Continuation on your programme is subject to specific health requirements (consistent with the provisions of the Equality Act [2010]). Students are required to inform the School of any change in

health status that may impact on practice or their studies, throughout their period of enrolment, at the earliest opportunity
